

Why does Albania need to import energy?

Why is solar energy so underdeveloped in Albania?

This was mainly due to hydropower and the use of wood biomass in some households. Until 2017 Albania only offered renewable energy incentives for hydropower and as a result solar PV and wind have remained underdeveloped. However, in late 2023, a 140 MW solar plant was reported to have come online.
