

Armenia's grid-connected wind power generation system

How much wind power does Armenia have?

A 2003 study by the U.S. Department of Energy's National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) estimated Armenia's land areas with "good-to-excellent" wind resource potential to be around 1,000 km². With a conservative assumption of 5 MW per km², the authors noted that the area could support almost 5,000 MW of potential installed capacity.

How many wind farms are there in Armenia?

Armenia's wind energy sector is minuscule. The entire country has just four wind farms with an installed capacity of 4.23 MW and an average annual generation of 3.97 GWh.

How does ADB support Armenia's Wind energy potential?

The Government of Armenia requested support from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) in exploring opportunities to develop Armenia's wind energy potential. ADB responded to the request by preparing the first of two planned phases of technical assistance (TA).

What is Armenia's long-term energy strategy?

In its long-term strategy (up to 2040) for the energy sector, adopted in January 2021, the Armenian government identified the maximum utilization of renewable energy potential as a priority.

How much wind energy can a grid-connected plant generate?

Another study in 2010 by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) assessed the "total wind energy potential for grid-connected plants" to be over 1,000 MW, but only half of that, around 500 MW, with annual generation potential over 1,000 GWh, is "currently considered feasible."

What is the least-cost energy development plan for Armenia?

A least-cost energy development plan for Armenia (2019), sponsored by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), identifies the development of Armenia's abundant solar and wind potential as the clear least-cost options for new generation capacity.
