How does a BMS measure a battery pack?

Generally, a BMS measures bidirectional battery pack current both in charging mode and discharging mode. A method called Coulomb counting uses these measured currents to calculate the SoC and SoH of the battery pack. The magnitude of currents during charging and discharging modes could be drastically different by one or two orders of magnitude.

How does a BMS measure bidirectional battery pack current?

Therefore, in discharging mode, current flows in the opposite direction from charging mode, out of the HV+ terminal. Generally, a BMS measures bidirectional battery pack current both in charging mode and discharging mode. A method called Coulomb counting uses these measured currents to calculate the SoC and SoH of the battery pack.

How to monitor current in a BMS?

There are 2 basic methods to monitor current in a BMS. The 2 methods are using a resistive shunt or using a Hall-effect mechanism. A resistive shunt sensor is a low-value (0.1 m Ω) high-precision resistor in series with a battery pack. This can be seen in the circuit diagram below.

Can a battery management system monitor electrical current?

Battery management systems must not only monitor temperature and voltage but must also monitor current in its system. It must be able to ensure that excessive amounts of current are not flowing through the system. They're required to log abuse conditions. In order to monitor electrical current through a BMS, we cannot measure current directly.

How does a battery monitoring system work?

The BMS monitors the individual cell voltage of every lithium-ion cell, checks for its temperature, and monitors the charging and discharging current of the system. In temperature monitoring, it sends a current signal to the CCS of the battery pack. The resistance of the CCS' NTC thermistors varies as the temperature changes of the cells.
