

Do I need a power outlet in Costa Rica?

The two most important things to note with the power outlets in Costa Rica is that they are Type A and B. If you come from a country that uses these plug types, you will not need an adapter.

### What voltage is used in Costa Rica?

Voltage in Costa Rica The standard voltage for electrical outlets in Costa Rica is between 110 and 120 volts AC. U.S. and Canadian 120 Volt appliances and multiple voltage devices like laptops and cellphones will be fine with Costa Rica's voltage. Remember that plug adapters do not change the voltage, just the physical plug to outlet connection.
