#### What type of gas does a double-paned window use?

The gap between glass in a double-paned window is filled with a safe gas such as argon,krypton,or xenon,increasing the window's resistance to energy transfer. This gas,denser than air,is the barrier against outside temperatures that single-paned windows cannot offer. Argon: Argon is a common and most affordable type of gas.

These windows feature two panes of glass with a gas or air pocket between them, providing superior insulation. Compared to the now uncommon single-paned windows, double-paned options deliver improved energy efficiency, enhanced soundproofing, and greater comfort inside the home. #### How thick is a double glazed window?

There is a little more to it than that, and with double-glazed windows, science comes into play. The components of a double-glazed window are: Each glass pane in a double-glazed window is 4 to 6 mm thick, and the gas layer between the panes measures 6 to 20 mm. This means the thickness of the window averages about 24 mm.

#### How much does a double glazed window cost?

Double-glazed windows cost from \$270 to \$900 per window, for double-hung windows (the type that open up and down). Double-glazed casement windows cost from \$355 to \$900 per window unit. Are double-glazed windows worth the cost? Double-glazed windows are worth the cost for most homeowners.

#### What is inert gas in double glazed windows?

Inert gasses, including argon, xenon, and krypton, are used between the panes of a double-glazed window. Because inert gas moves and transfers hot or cold through space much more slowly than air, this enhances the insulation provided by the double glazing.
