What is a good duty cycle for a grid connected inverter?

Info: I'm talking about grid connected inverters. The strategy would be not to require duty cycles that are close to 0% or 100%. About all you can do beyond avoiding it entirely, is dithering. If you needed 99%, alternate between 98% and 100% for example. Whether that total screws up your application I don't know.

Can a high side inverter go to 100% duty cycle?

If your high side drivers require charge pump operation (they use a bootstrap capacitor) you cannot go to 100% duty cycle (though arguably you can go to 0% as you don't need to drive the high side switch). For a grid connected inverter, changing the output phase angle will reduce power while maintaining VA and alter the net power factor.

What factors affect the efficiency of an inverter?
