What is a high voltage line?

These high voltage lines transmit electric power generated at power stations which are situated at remote locations. Power stations are built away from the cities where natural resources are available and are transmitted to the load centres. Electricity is transmitted at high voltages up to 1.2MV (1200 kilo Volts) in some countries.

What are the components of a high voltage substation?

The main components of a high voltage substation are transformers (for voltage changes), circuit breakers and disconnect switches (for protection and isolation), busbars (for power distribution), instrument transformers (for measurement), surge arresters (for overvoltage protection), and control systems (for monitoring and automation).

Why is power transmitted at high voltage?
