What is the role of energy storage in a wind farm?

How much storage capacity does an offshore wind park need?

This means that for an offshore wind park with a nominal power of 50 MW and a capacity factor of 30%, a storage capacity of about 1300 MWh is required. This, in turn, implies an effective capacity for the upper reservoir of a pumped storage system of about 1,700,000 m<sup>3</sup> with a net head of 300 m.

Do offshore wind parks need storage power plants?

The large quantities of electricity production from offshore wind parks imply the introduction of respectively adequate storage power plants. The available technologies for large power storage plants are the PSSs and the CAESs. PSSs are the only power storage technology with tens of different installations around the world.
