

Substation and power generation room

What is an electric power substation?

For the most part, electric power substations are viewed as the most integral part of a power utilities' electric system, with electric systems being comprised of power generation, transmission, and distribution systems. (See A Basic Explanation Summary of How the Electric Power Grid Works)

What is a Generator Substation?

Generating substations step up the voltage from the generator's lower voltage to a higher voltage which is more suitable, and more economical for transmitting electric power over longer distances with less power losses caused by the impedances of transmission lines.

Do I need a separate control room in a substation?

Except for large and medium-sized factory substations, there is no need to set up a separate control room in substation layout of general property power supply such as home solar power system. (2) The control room is generally connected to the 6-10kV high-voltage power distribution room.

What do you need to know about substations?

The basic things about substations you **MUST** know in the middle of the night! In a less simple way, substation is the key part of electrical generation, transmission, and distribution systems. Substation transforms voltage from high to low or from low to high as necessary.

What are the design requirements for a substation?

The guideline covers basic design requirements for associated architectural, mechanical and electrical systems. Separate the room from occupied spaces or provide sound-proofing so the 60 Hz hum is not audible to occupants (sound level of 40dB or less) in adjacent areas, including those rooms above and below the substation room.

How should a 4 10 (6)kV substation layout be arranged?

(4) 10 (6)KV substation layout should be arranged in a single floor. When a two-floor substation layout is adopted, the transformer should be located on the bottom floor, and the power distribution room on the second floor should have lifting holes and a lifting platform.
