Is there a 20-year power sector development plan for Timor-Leste?

This study report presents the results of a 20-year power sector development plan for Timor-Leste (East Timor). Keywords: adb projects, power sector, power sector development plan, electrification program, generation and transmission, rural electrification, expenditure program, technical assistance, timor leste.

What is the medium-term Generation and transmission plan for Timor-Leste?

The medium-term Generation and transmission plan for Timor-Leste recognizes two alternative scenarios. Scenario 1: The development of a mixed hydro-thermal generation system and gradual interconnection of the separate systems into a single grid over a 20-year period.

How much electricity will Timor-Leste require?

According to Table 3, Timor-Leste will need to plan for 50-100 MW of additional generation capacity over the next two decades, depending on the growth in demand and the pace of electrification.

Who is responsible for the electricity sector in East Timor-Leste?

Since 2002, the Government of Timor-Leste has been responsible for the administration of the electricity sector in East Timor-Leste. Responsibility was transferred from the East Timor Transitional Administration (ETTA) in August 2001. Four main laws have shaped the development of the electricity sector since 1999.

What is the project regarding in Timor-Leste?

The project is a 3-year study to prepare a wind map of the most promising locations and to prepare a feasibility study of economically viable grid-connected and isolated wind power potential in Timor-Leste.

What is the human resources vacuum in Timor-Leste?

The human resources issue in Timor-Leste's power sector has been exacerbated by the vacuum that resulted from the 1999 events. When the power system was operated as a branch of PLN, management and workers were mainly Indonesian, most of whom left Timor-Leste in 1999. This has made it difficult to restore power sector operations.
