

Which solar projects have been approved in Tunisia?

The Tunisian government has granted licenses to four PV projects with a combined capacity of 500 MW. The selected developers are Qair International, Voltaia, Toyota Tsusho and Scatec. Tunisia's Minister of Industry, Mines and Energy, Fatima Al-Thabat Shibb, has approved four solar projects with a combined capacity of 500 MW.

Is Tunisia ready for a large-scale solar project?

It previously completed a 500 MW solar tender in December 2019. In October 2024, Tunisia launched a new tender for 200 MW of large-scale solar, with submissions due by Jan. 15, 2025. Tunisia's total solar capacity reached 506 MW by the end of 2023, according to the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA).

How is Tunisia advancing utility-scale solar?

Tunisia is advancing utility-scale solar through a series of tenders, including the latest procurement round launched in January 2023. It previously completed a 500 MW solar tender in December 2019. In October 2024, Tunisia launched a new tender for 200 MW of large-scale solar, with submissions due by Jan. 15, 2025.

What is a PPA in Tunisia?

The PPA was awarded in December 2024 through a government tender to support Tunisia's ambitious renewable energy targets and to enhance the country's energy security. Scatec has further signed a Joint Development Agreement, with Aeolus SAS (Aeolus), part of the Japanese conglomerate Toyota Tsusho Group, for the project.

Who owns Sidi Bouzid & Tozeur solar projects in Tunisia?

The agreement enhances the partners' collaboration in Tunisia, building on the success of the 60 MW Sidi Bouzid I and 60 MW Tozeur solar projects currently under construction. Scatec will own 50% of the Sidi Bouzid II project, while Aeolus will own 50%.
