How much energy does Turkmenistan use?

According to the Statistical Review of World Energy 2024, primary energy consumption in Turkmenistan in 2023 amounted to 1.60 exajoules and was dominated by natural gas - 82.5%, ahead of oil - 17.5%. Does Turkmenistan have a good electricity supply?

This also applies to the Electricity from other renewable sources indicator. According to the primary statistics, Turkmenistan has a relatively good electricity generation to consumption ratio (0.77) and high ratio of Primary energy use per capita (0.83).

What is a 100 MW solar installation project in Turkmenistan?

100 MW Solar Photovoltaic Installation Project: Masdar and Turkmenenergo signed a joint development agreement for a solar park, following a memorandum in October 2021 to explore low-carbon energy potential in Turkmenistan.

How much methane does Turkmenistan emit?

With natural gas dominating Turkmenistan's energy mix, vast methane emissions come from venting methane gas during oil production in the oil fields. According to the World Bank, Turkmenistan's methane emissions in 2020 amounted to 8,317,920 kt of CO₂ equivalent. Yet, recent satellite data suggests that these figures may be underestimated.

What is the solar potential of Turkmenistan?

Average Theoretical Solar Potential: 4.4 kWh/m², roughly 655 GW of additional capacity.
