What is superconducting magnetic energy storage (SMES)?

Superconducting magnetic energy storage (SMES) systems store energy in the magnetic field created by the flow of direct current in a superconducting coil that has been cryogenically cooled to a temperature below its superconducting critical temperature. This use of superconducting coils to store magnetic energy was invented by M. Ferrier in 1970.

The most significant benefit of SMES is the minimal time delay between charge and discharge. Power is practically instantly available, and very high power output can be delivered for a short time.

What is a superconducting magnet?

Superconducting magnets are the core components of the system and are able to store current as electromagnetic energy in a lossless manner. The system acts as a bridge between the superconducting magnet and the power grid and is responsible for energy exchange.

What is the difference between SMES and superconducting materials?

Both use superconducting materials but store energy in different physical forms (magnetic fields versus rotational motion). SMES stores energy in a persistent direct current flowing through a superconducting coil, producing a magnetic field.

How is energy stored in a superconducting coil?

As a result, the energy is stored in the coil in both magnetic and electric forms, and it may be recovered in a relatively short period. Ferrier invented the use of superconducting coils to store magnetic energy in 1970. The coil must be superconducting; otherwise, the energy is wasted in a few milliseconds due to the Joule effect.
