



# What is the heat consumption of solar panels

What is solar panel heat?

Solar panel heat is the rise in temperature that solar panels experience when they absorb sunlight. The temperature increases due to the photovoltaic effect - the conversion of light into electricity - which is not 100% efficient and results in the generation of heat. The effects of this temperature rise on solar panels are multiple:

Are solar panels hot?

Most solar panels have a rated "solar panel max temperature" of 185 degrees Fahrenheit- which seems intense. However, solar panels are hotter than the air around them because they are absorbing the sun's heat, and because they are built to be tough, high temperatures will not degrade them. Are solar panels hot to the touch?

How does temperature affect solar panel efficiency?

Solar panel efficiency is significantly tied to temperature. At higher operating temperatures, efficiency generally drops due to increased resistance within the solar cells. For most photovoltaic panels, the optimal operating temperature range is between 25°C to 30°C. Going beyond this range results in noticeable declines in performance.

Do solar panels lose efficiency if it gets hot?

Regardless, solar panels are most efficient at temperatures of up to 77-degrees F. A solar panel's efficiency decreases when it gets hotter than this range. Please remember that different panels lose efficiency at different rates. The good news is that the solar panel's loss of efficiency is something that gets examined for each panel.
